Toddlers with Type 1 diabetes should be given their insulin as prescribed. Toddlers with Type 1 diabetes should eat a balanced, healthy diet, with regular meals and snacks, with attention paid to the amount of carbohydrates in each meal.

How To Manage Diabetes In Toddlers

Diabetes affects everyone differently, but it also affects the people close to it daily too. Caring for your child with type 1 diabetes can have a positive and worthwhile impact on your life, but this doesn't mean you don't need support sometimes too.. A lot of people don't see themselves as a carer of their child - they're just doing their job as a parent or guardian.

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Coping with caring for a child with type 1 diabetes ...

If your child is diagnosed with type 1 diabetes, they'll be looked after by a children's (paediatric) diabetes care team until they're around 18. The care team will help with the things needed to manage your child's type 1 diabetes, such as injecting insulin, testing blood glucose levels, and diet. They can give advice on school or nursery, and talk to your child's teachers and carers.

Managing Type 1 Diabetes Postpartum: Self-Care After Baby ...

Your baby may need extra care in a neonatal unit if she or he is unwell, needs close monitoring or treatment, has to be fed through a tube or a drip, or is premature. Your baby's blood glucose levels You should start feeding your baby as soon as possible after birth (within 30 minutes), and then every 2 to 3 hours, to help his or her blood glucose stay at a safe level.

Diabetes Care for Babies, Toddlers, and Preschoolers: A ...

There are two subtypes of diabetes: type 1 and type 2. Type 1, sometimes called juvenile diabetes, is the kind that affects babies and toddlers. The exact cause of type 1 diabetes is not known, but it is believed that the body destroys the cells that normally make insulin, a hormone that keeps blood sugar levels in check.

Diabetes in Babies

Your baby may need a glucose and water mixture as an early feeding. Or your baby may need glucose given into a vein (intravenously or IV). Your baby's healthcare provider will closely watch his or her blood sugar levels. This is done in case your baby's blood sugar levels drop too low. Help with breathing

Your baby will have a heel prick blood test a few hours after they're born to check if their blood glucose level is too low. If your baby's blood glucose can't be kept at a safe level, or they are having problems feeding, they may need extra care. Your baby may need to be fed through a tube or given a drip to increase their blood glucose.
