The Office of Shared Accountability in Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) is conducting a multiyear evaluation of the Achieving Collegiate Excellence and Success (ACES) program. The ACES program is a collaboration between MCPS, Montgomery College (MC) and the Universities at Shady Grove to create a seamless pathway from high school to college completion. It focuses on identifying and supporting both students who are underrepresented in higher education and those who would be the first in their family to attend college. A central element to the ACES program is the presence of coaches at each institution. School year 2014-2015 was Year Two of the ACES program. These students participated in Year One of ACES as 12th graders and graduated from MCPS in 2014. As part of a series of reports about Year Two of ACES, this document concerns the first year of participants at MC and addresses the following outcome evaluation questions: (1) What is the academic success of the ACES students at MC? (2) Are there variations in academic success among subgroups of ACES students at MC? Subgroups included race/ethnicity and services received in high school, and (3) Are there differences in academic success between ACES students and a comparison group of students at MC? Many positive outcomes for the first group of ACES students at MC included almost all being enrolled in at least one college-credit course and largely successful, in terms of academic standing, mean GPA, and pass rate. This study analyzed measures of academic success for the students who were enrolled in the ACES program at MC for the 2014-2015 year. Data were gathered from ACES program staff, MC student-level records, and MCPS student-level records. An appendix with one table is included.

The student teaching experience is often considered one of the most influential aspects of teacher preparation. Key in the success of student teaching is the university supervisor. During the student teaching experience, the university supervisor is mainly responsible for helping pre-service teachers relate university coursework with the situated experiences in schools. However, much like the various other spaces and places in teacher education, facilitating teacher learning is an incredibly complex endeavor. This edited volume addresses the complexities of supervising student teachers from three distinct vantage points. First, salient issues regarding the supervision of student teachers such as the preparation of novice supervisors, negotiating power in the student teaching triad, and the low status of clinical teacher education are examined. Second, different pedagogical frameworks for the work of supervision are provided such as care theory, teacher education for democracy, and social justice. Finally, future directions for field-based teacher education are discussed, such as a call to reconsider where supervision takes place, the necessity to develop a pedagogy of supervision, 21st century trends facing clinical teacher education, and the value added by university supervisors to teacher development. Each of these chapters engage the supervision of student teachers through a mix of research, theory, and personal stories from the field. As such, this edited volume is designed for new supervisors, veteran supervisors, and supervision scholars.

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The purpose of the Handbook of Special Education is to help profile and bring greater clarity to the already sprawling and continuously expanding field of special education. To ensure consistency across the volume, chapter authors review and integrate existing research, identify strengths and weaknesses, note gaps in the literature, and discuss implications for practice and future research. The second edition has been fully updated throughout to take into account recent changes to federal laws as well as the most current academic research, and an entirely new section has been added on research methods in special education.

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
