Reference Intervals in Neonatal Hematology
If blood is required in an emergency, e.g. blood loss at delivery, O Rhd -ve blood should be used. A blood grouping sample should be taken from the baby prior to emergency transfusion 1 unit (In some hospitals this may be divided into 4 Paedipacks) of O Rhd -ve, leucodepleted, CMV and Hepatitis E -ve blood is available for emergency paediatric use in the satellite blood fridge, the locations ...

Neonatal transfusion guideline
Newborn blood spot screening involves taking a blood sample to find out if your baby has 1 of 9 rare but serious health conditions. Most babies won't have any of these conditions but, for the few who do, the benefits of screening are enormous. Early treatment can improve their health, and prevent severe disability or even death.

%To assess the effectiveness of ventilation, circulation and perfusion %Blood gases indicate if the baby is able to move air in and out of the lungs well enough to obtain the oxygen it needs, and dispose of the carbon dioxide it doesn't %Blood gases can also tell us if the baby is having to use its energy stores in anaerobic metabolism

The most common haematological problems in neonates are anaemia and thrombocytopenia. The majority of neonatal haematological disorders presenting in the first few days of life have their origin in utero and are unique to neonates, such as haemolytic disease of the newborn, Transient Abnormal Myelopoiesis in neonates with Down syndrome and haemorrhagic disease of the newborn.
