Bariatric surgery increases life expectancy vs. usual ...

Weight loss surgery, also called bariatric or metabolic surgery, is sometimes used as a treatment for people who are very obese. It can lead to significant weight loss and help improve many obesity-related conditions, such as type 2 diabetes or high blood pressure .

Weight loss surgery - NHS

Bariatric surgery is a tool to aid in weight loss, but is not a cure. To successfully lose weight and maintain this weight loss, people who have bariatric surgery must commit to healthy eating and regular physical activity for the rest of their lives. Care After Bariatric Surgery - Committing to Healthy Choices

Bariatric surgery induces weight loss and restores glucose metabolism in patients with obesity and type 2 diabetes (T2D) (1). In patients with autoimmune diabetes that eventually results in β -cell failure, the glycemic effects of bariatric surgery are limited (2).

Obesity related bariatric surgery admissions, by year and gender. In 2018/19 there were 7,011 hospital admissions with a primary diagnosis of obesity and a main or secondary procedure of bariatric surgery. This is an increase of 6% on 2017/18 (6,627). Over three quarters (79%) of admissions were for females.

Among patients with obesity, bariatric surgery was associated with longer life expectancy than usual obesity care. Mortality remained higher in both groups than in the general population.

The Obesity Surgery Society of India (OSSSI) has recommended that bariatric surgery can be offered to: Patients with BMI of over 37.5 even without any other disease Patients with BMI of 32.5 with coexisting medical conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, sleep apnoea, PCOD, osteo-arthritis and seriously impaired lifestyle

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Bariatric surgery is a recognized and accepted approach for both weight-loss and many of the conditions that occur as a result of severe obesity; however, not all people affected by severe obesity will qualify for bariatric surgery. There are certain criteria that a person must meet in order to be a candidate for bariatric surgery.

Bariatric surgery is the option of choice for adults with a BMI of more than 50 kg/m² when other interventions have not been effective. It is also recommended as a treatment option for some adults with a BMI of 40 kg/m² or more, or between 35 kg/m² and 40 kg/m² with other significant disease that could be improved if they lost weight, for example, type 2 diabetes, hypertension, or severe mobility problems.

Importance Bariatric surgery has been associated with improvements in health in patients with severe obesity; however, it is unclear whether these health benefits translate into lower health care expenditures.

1.10.1 Bariatric surgery is a treatment option for people with obesity if all of the following criteria are fulfilled: They have a BMI of 40 kg/m² or more, or between 35 kg/m² and 40 kg/m² and other significant disease (for example, type 2 diabetes or high blood pressure) that could be improved if they lost weight.

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
