The Archdeaconry Of Richmond In The Archdeacon of Richmond and Craven is an archdiocesan post in the Church of England. It is under the jurisdiction of the Diocese of Leeds (until 1836 it was part of the Diocese of Chester, and from 1836 until 2014 in the Diocese of Ripon). It is divided into seven rural deaneries: Bowland, Ewecross, Harrogate, Richmond, Ripon, Skipton, and Wensley.

In the twelfth century the Archdeaconry of Richmond was said to be the richest in England, and the archdeaconry spanned the counties of Yorkshire, Westmorland, Cumberland and Lancashire.</div></div>

" The Archdeaconry of Richmond, as originally constituted, is of great antiquity, and was looked upon as the richest in England: it was erected by Thomas, Archbishop of York, in the year 1090, and included Allerdale and Cumberland, which were taken out of it by Henry I, in 1127, to establish the see of Carlisle.</div></div>
